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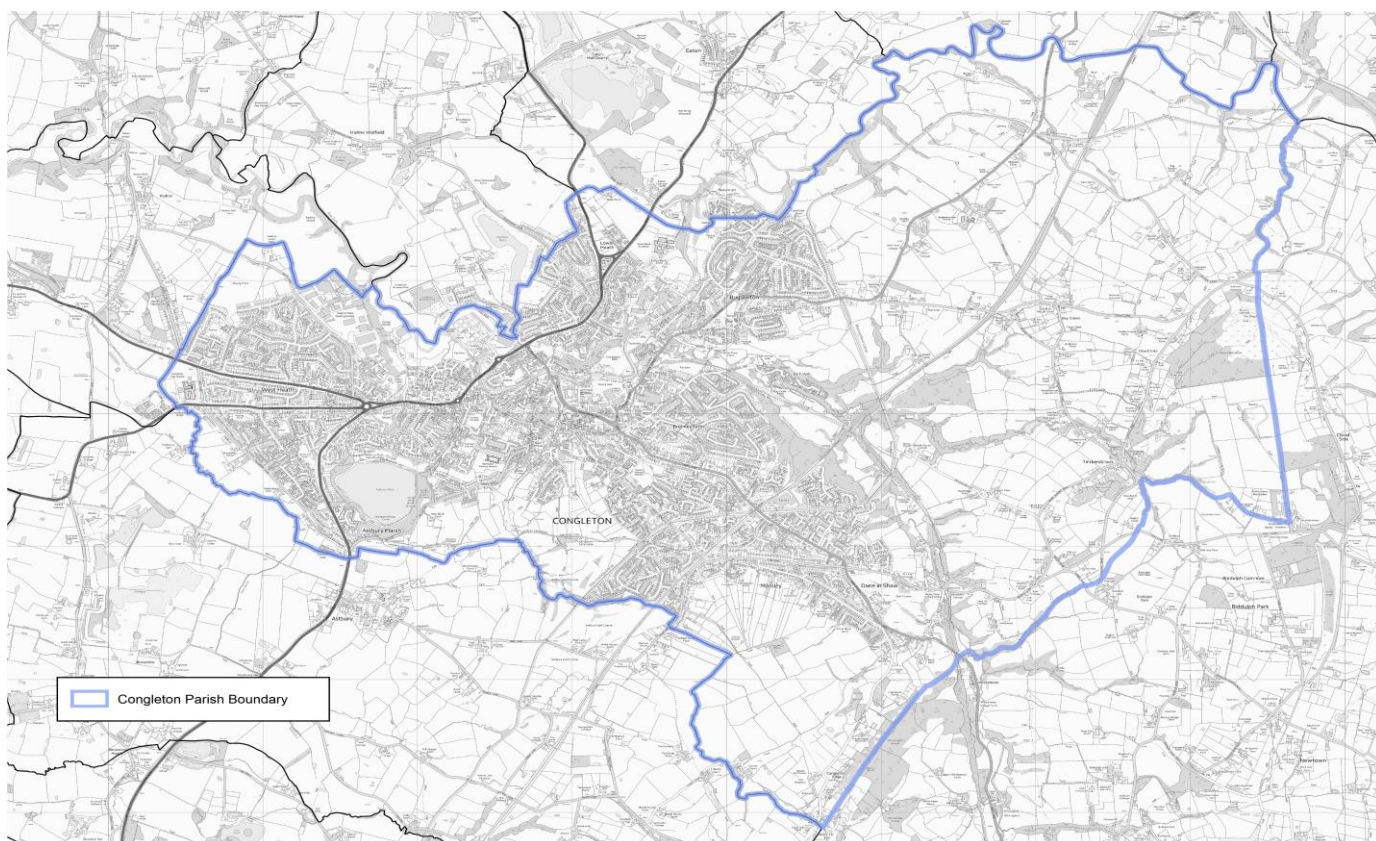

1. Introduction and Background

2. This Consultation Statement has been prepared in accordance with The Neighbourhood Planning (General) Regulations 2012 (SI No. 637) Part 5 Paragraph 15 (2) which defines a “consultation statement” as a *document which:*
- (a) *contains details of the persons and bodies who were consulted about the proposed neighbourhood development plan*
 - (b) *explains how they were consulted*
 - (c) *summarises the main issues and concerns raised by the persons consulted*
 - (d) *describes how these issues and concerns have been considered and, where relevant, addressed in the proposed neighbourhood development plan.*

1.2 The process started in summer 2014 when Congleton Town Council approached Cheshire East Council about gaining permission to produce a
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Neighbourhood Development Plan. Initially it was hoped that the process could be completed within a year or so, but the process turned out to be more complicated and detailed than first anticipated.

1.3 Creating a Neighbourhood Plan for Congleton was made more complicated due to:

- a) The size of the town – population 26,418 at the last census - meaning that there was a large number of people to consult.
- b) Congleton as a key service centre area is expected to grow by 4,150 houses over the lifetime of the Cheshire East Local Plan. The Neighbourhood Plan needs to reflect the growing needs of this expanding community, however much of the housing will be located in parishes outside of the Congleton Neighbourhood Development Plan area – and will require the co-operation of these Parishes.
- c) The Cheshire East Local Plan was not adopted until July 2017 and the delay in the adoption together with the lengthy and adversarial Local Plan Inquiry made the formulation of policies difficult. Many of the Congleton Borough Local Plan policies were adopted before 2005 and were now out of date.
- d) The Congleton Neighbourhood Plan team was keen to explore all the options and carry out robust and detailed research into all aspects of the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan. Gaining consensus amongst strong working groups was not always easy.

1.4 In summary the processes that the Congleton Neighbourhood went through were:

- a) Seeking permission to carry out a Congleton Neighbourhood Plan Development Plan
- b) Gathering local volunteers and councillors to make up the Steering Group and working groups
- c) Research into existing and proposed policies and proposed changes to national planning guidance
- d) Initial questionnaire and gaining an understanding of the communities aspirations for the town
- e) Further research and revising policies based on feedback
- f) More detailed research and commissioning of detailed survey work
- g) More detailed questionnaire and working in groups on the comments and how that impacts on the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan
- h) Further research and working out how to take on board comments from the second questionnaire
- i) Time to collect further evidence and commission reports

- j) Regulation 14 consultation
- k) Taking on board feedback from Regulation 14 consultation, revising policies and getting agreement from the full team on the way forward to submit the Regulation 15 version of the plan.

2. Draft Neighbourhood Development Plan and Informal Public Consultation

2.1 Community Engagement

- a) Congleton Town Council (CTC) submitted application to Cheshire East Council in summer 2014. A six week consultation into the application, held from the 20th August 2014 to the 9th October 2014 led to 10 responses – three supported, one objected and six were comments only. The Congleton Neighbourhood Plan Area was formally designated on the 6th November 2014. (see Map 1)
- b) In October 2014 the Town Council's newsletter, Bear Necessities, which is delivered to 11,500 households in CW12 announced that Congleton was looking to produce a Neighbourhood Plan. It invited those interested in getting involved with the plan to contact the Town Clerk. (Articles in Appendix 4)
- c) CTC also wrote out to many Congleton groups and organisations inviting people to help form a neighbourhood plan steering group or if they had a specific interest to help advise a working group
- d) In November 2014, Congleton Town Council was notified that Cheshire East Council had granted permission to develop a Neighbourhood Development Plan
- e) The first meeting of the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group was held on the 15th January 2015. A number of concerns were raised about issues of the Link Road (a new 5.5 kilometre route planned to link the A534 Sandbach Road to the west of Congleton with the A536 Macclesfield Road) and many of the new 4150 houses being built outside of the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan area in the adjacent Parishes to the north of Congleton that would have a direct impact on the CNPA. It was believed that a more joined up approach to a plan across a wider area would be preferable. Cheshire East Council was asked to help with the impasse.
- f) Before drafting any elements of the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan started members of CNPSG consulted the Neighbourhood Planning Manager of Cheshire East Council (CEC) at walk-in workshops in Macclesfield and Sandbach. Members of CNPSG also attended meetings with representatives of the neighbouring Parish Council about the possibility of forming a wider Neighbourhood Plan area. This was rejected.

- g) CNPSG studied not only the CEC template for a neighbourhood plan but also elements of the neighbourhood plans of other town councils that were close to the stage of adoption by CEC or that were being promoted at good examples by the Institute of Planning. The CNPSG also decided to employ a planning consultant, Andrew Thompson DipTP MRTPI to guide them through the legal and planning laws
- h) The Town Clerk of the Town Council was elected to be the Chairperson of the Steering Group, terms of reference for CNPSG were agreed. Research was carried out into existing policies, plans and visions for Congleton. When the Town Clerk retired in March 2016, the new Chief Officer took on the role of Chair of the Steering Group.
- i) March 2015 – the Steering Group set out its structure, the remit of the various working groups set up to tackle specific areas and working protocols between the groups. The working groups would enable more interested volunteers to get involved and enable concentrated, detailed work to be carried out. The chairperson of each group would sit and report back to the Steering Group.
- i) Sustainability and Environment
 - ii) Education, Health and Wellbeing
 - iii) Town Centre and Heritage
 - iv) Transportation
 - v) Housing
 - vi) Communications
- j) 4th March 2015 Members of the Steering Group met with Cheshire East Planners at Sandbach to discuss concerns about the Congleton Masterplan, meaningful plans for sites across Neighbourhood Plans and uncertainties around the Local Plan.
- k) 11th March 2015 – A Workshop was held in the Town Hall to discuss the vision for Congleton's Neighbourhood Plan – taking on board feedback from recent consultations not carried out specifically for the Neighbourhood plan but relevant to the subjects covered by the Neighbourhood Plan. Express was raised about consultation fatigue felt in the town and the need for action rather than more questioning of what people want.
- l) From the outset, CNPSG has issued press releases to advertise its starting work on a neighbourhood plan and thereafter to report progress.
- m) A website for the neighbourhood plan and a twitter feed was established at the beginning of May 2015 and was advertised widely. It was included as part of the questionnaire distributed to all households. Throughout the preparation of the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan all relevant documents have been placed on www.mycongleton.org

2.1 First Questionnaire

- a) Lots of detailed consultation work gathering views of people in Congleton had already been carried out for the Congleton Town Plan, the Congleton Development Plan, research into plans for a new shopping centre, research by Manchester university students into what people in Congleton wanted, so the Congleton NP team were aware of consultation fatigue. The group agreed that the initial questionnaire into the Neighbourhood Plan needed to be quite straightforward and seek to clarify some key questions.
- b) Agreed each work group would submit a maximum of three questions.
- c) An A3 folded 4 sides of A4 paper questionnaire was delivered to all households in CW12 1-4. This accounted for 11,500 questionnaires. Further copies of the questionnaires were made available at the following drop off points:
 - i. Co-op Bromley Road
 - ii. Co-op St Johns Road, Buglawton
 - iii. Mossley Pharmacy
 - iv. Porters Garage, Padgbury Lane
 - v. Tesco Barn Road
 - vi. West Heath Pharmacy
 - vii. Congleton Town Hall

In addition an electronic version of the questionnaire was added to both the mycongleton.org and the Congleton Town Council websites and the link sent out to shops, traders and the Town Council's database of local groups.
- d) The questionnaire was sent out from the 13 May with a response deadline of the 20th June. As an added incentive the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan offered the chance to enter a free prize draw worth £250 for a random entry pulled identified from a random number generator. 812 people entered the competition.
- e) The questionnaire was further publicised via banners placed around the town centre, vinyls on an empty shop window in Mill Street, publicity in the local press and an edition of Bear Necessities that was sent out to households during the consultation period.
- f) In addition the team held road show events at
 - i. Tesco, Barn Road, instore handing out questionnaire and answering questions Thursday 11th June 11am – 2pm

- ii. West Heath Shopping Centre – handing out questionnaires and answering questions Saturday 13th June 11 – 3pm
 - iii. Congleton Pedestrian area during the busy Food and Drink Festival, Sunday 14th June 10.30am – 4.30pm
 - iv. Teddy Bears Picnic - Tuesday 16th June 12.30 – 2.30pm
- g) 1,404 responses were returned – which compares well with consultations. The split was 51% female, 49% male, 287 responded online whilst 1,227 filled in paper copies that were digitally inputted before being analysed.
 - i. 8% were 15- 24 years old
 - ii. 24% were 25 -44 years old
 - iii. 37% were 45- 64 years old
 - iv. 31% were over 65 years old

h) Some key findings from this survey were:

- i) 49% of those answering were not planning to move house.
- ii) Of those that were planning to move the most popular location was to the outskirts of Congleton.
- iii) 90% said new development land should be allocated near the Link Road with easy access to the M6
- iv) 91% wanted to see the Link Road extended to Newcastle Road (54% to Buxton Road) 42% said they would cycle or walk much more if the footpaths/cycleways were improved All the green spaces listed were ranked as important with Astbury Mere and Hankinson's Field/Park receiving the highest number of number 1 rankings.
- v) A broader retail offer (60%) and an improved market (40%) were seen as the most important ways to improve the Town Centre
- vi) Introducing Town Centre Heritage and Green Town Centre Trail was seen as most important for Heritage although all ideas were received favourably
- vii) The questionnaire gave details about people's current and aspirational living needs, working habits, views on green space and the environment, the link road, what is needed for the town centre (this also lead to 212 comments for the Town Centre Group to take on board) and views on heritage. All the feedback and results were given to the working groups to further develop their plans
- viii) 54% owned their house outright, 30% owned their house with a

mortgage)

ix) 48% of people lived in two people households, 19% in four people households

x) Almost 60% had lived in Congleton for more than 20 years, 21% less than 10 years

xi) More people from CW12 4 answered than any other postcode (41% CW12 4, 25% CW12 3, 13% CW12 2, 11% CW12 1)

- i) The Congleton Neighbourhood Plan group was aware that this was the start of the consultation process and that a more detailed questionnaire was to follow. 358 people of the 1404 people who filled in the first questionnaire gave their email addresses and permission to send them a future more detailed questionnaire in the future.

2.2 Initial Consultation

In addition to the first questionnaire the group sent about finding out what particular groups wanted for their town. The CNP group sent launched a competition with the youngest members of the community to get their pictures of the Congleton in the future. The group also spent time with developers to understand their aspirations.

a) What Young People Want

A drawing competition for primary schools based on 'MyCongleton 2030' resulted in almost 200 entries with some interesting ideas. Some of the most common themes coming through from the primary schools were:

- open spaces
- entertainment
- education
- wider range of shops
- eco-friendly ideas such as Introducing tram, wind power
- better and wider sports facilities
- water parks and themed parks
- more restaurants, cinema, bowling complex
- more shops - sports, toys
- roof over the town centre
- big statues and artwork

b) What developers want

A meeting was held on the 29th July 2015 in the Town Hall where local developers were invited to attend and explain to the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan team what their visions for Congleton were and what they were interested in/ concerned about. The developers that attended were:

c) What's Pants and Gems?

A drop-in session at the Town Hall on the 8th July from 1pm – 8pm local people had an opportunity to look at display boards and information from each of the working groups. There were also asked for their opinions on What's Pants, What's Missing and What's a Gem in Congleton. The most common answers are given below.

2.4 Second Detailed Questionnaire

- a) A second more detailed public questionnaire was prepared by the group and sent out from the 18th December 2015 to the 25th January 2016. The deadline was later extended to the end of January.
- b) Local people were encouraged to fill in this questionnaire on-line although paper copies were sent out to those who requested it and made available from the Tourist Information Centre and library.
- c) 358 people from the previous questionnaire who had asked for a copy to be emailed directly to them were sent a copy.
- d) Emails were also sent containing a link to the questionnaire to those on the Congleton Town Council databases including Councillors, local groups and organisations, shops and key contacts.
- e) Postcards were sent to 11,500 households letting residents know about the second questionnaire and encouraging them to fill it in. As an incentive three randomly selected questionnaire respondents received £100 each.
- f) In addition banners were put up around the town informing people of the questionnaire and the deadlines, a press release was sent out and adverts in the local press.

- g) 946 questionnaires were completed, 665 filled out the on-line questionnaire, 149 replied to an email link version of the questionnaire and 132 filled in paper copies that were manually entered for purposes of analysing.
- h) Responses can be seen in Appendix two
- i) The themed groups were given all the results of the questionnaire along with the comments given in the open questions to use to develop policies in the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan to reflect local needs, desires and opinions. Some of the opinions conflicted. The majority of respondents strongly agreed with or agreed with policies being development in the plan.

2.5 Other Consultations during the formation of the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan

- a) Following the two questionnaire the individual working groups carried out more detailed consultation with local groups, organisations and professional bodies to help refine the policies in the plan – taking on board comments raised by local people in the consultations. This resulted in the following pieces of work. A full list of the studies, surveys and reports which have been used to develop the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan are listed in the evidence list in the Neighbourhood Plan Reg 15 and have been included in the evidence library available at www.mycongleton.org.uk. Particular pieces of research include:

 - xiv. Regular updates to Congleton Partnership Executive (quarterly)

2 Formal Consultation

- a) Congleton Neighbourhood Plan was sent to Cheshire East Borough Council Planners to check that all the policies were compliant ahead of being sent out to statutory and other interested parties for the formal regulation 14 consultation.
- b) A list of organisations sent a copy of the regulation 14 consultation is attached as appendix 3. Emails were sent to 701 people through survey monkey. This enabled the team to be sure that the emails had reached their target.
- c) In addition to the formal consultees the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan also advertised in the local press and through local banners and Bear Necessities that the plan was out for formal consultation. Paper copies of the draft plan were placed in the Tourist Information Centre and Congleton Library. Electronic copies were uploaded onto the Town Council website.
- d) The formal consultation period started on the 2nd October 2017 and was open until the 13th November 2017. The group were disappointed to only receive 44 comments from this consultation exercise. The comments received can be seen on appendix three.
- e) Since the close of Regulation 14 the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group has been modifying policies to take on board comments and making sure the draft Congleton Neighbourhood Plan reflects the comments received and are in line with the recent Cheshire East Neighbourhood Plan and changing planning legislation.

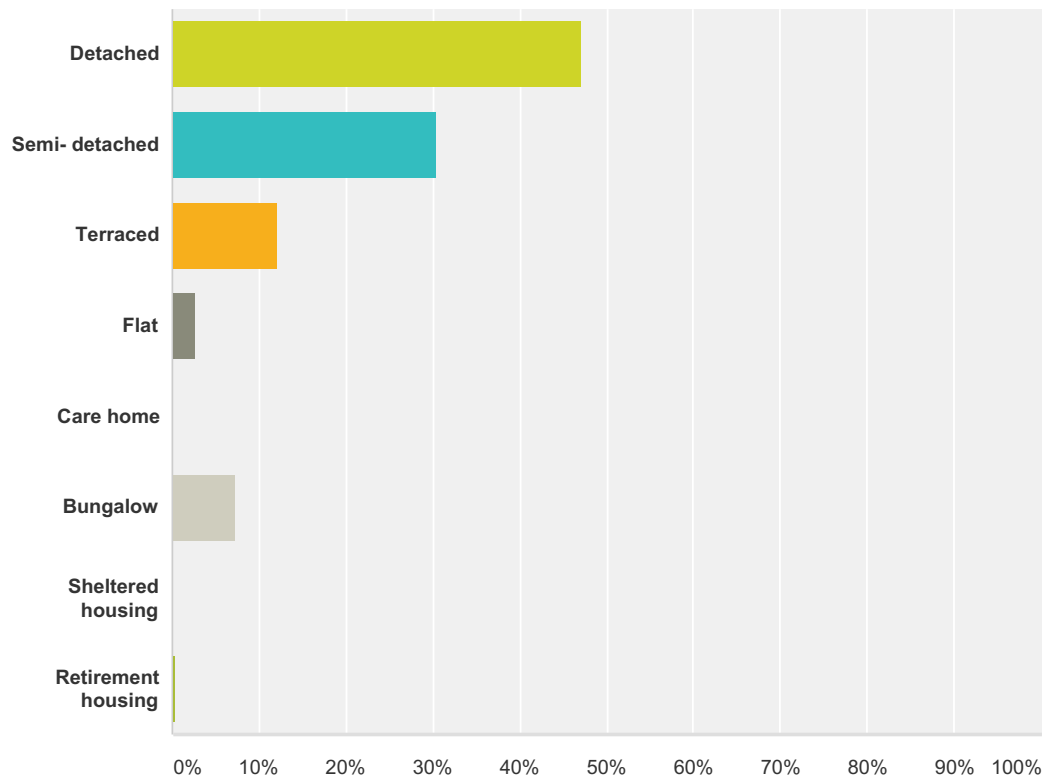

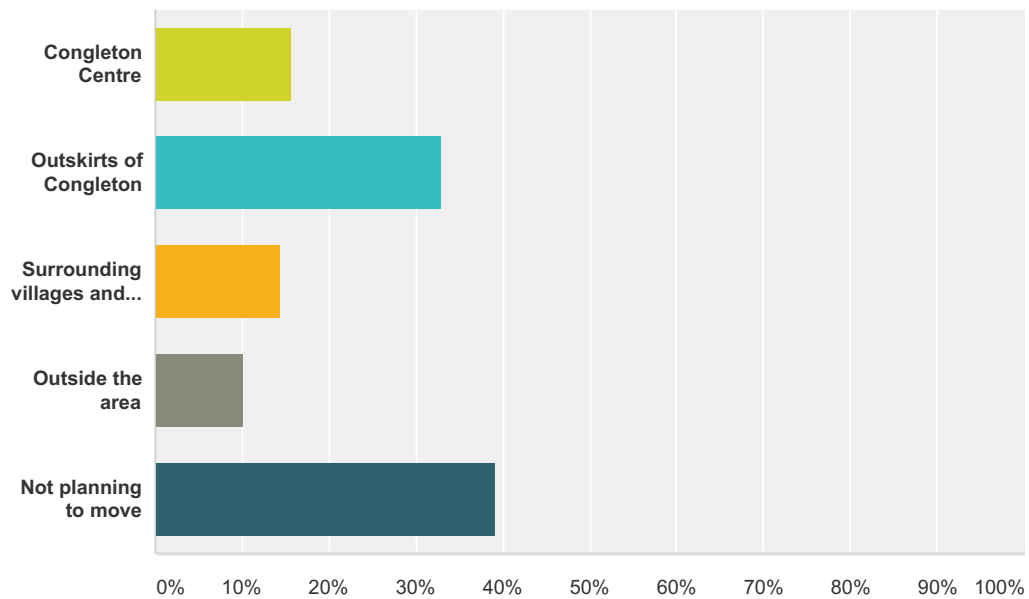

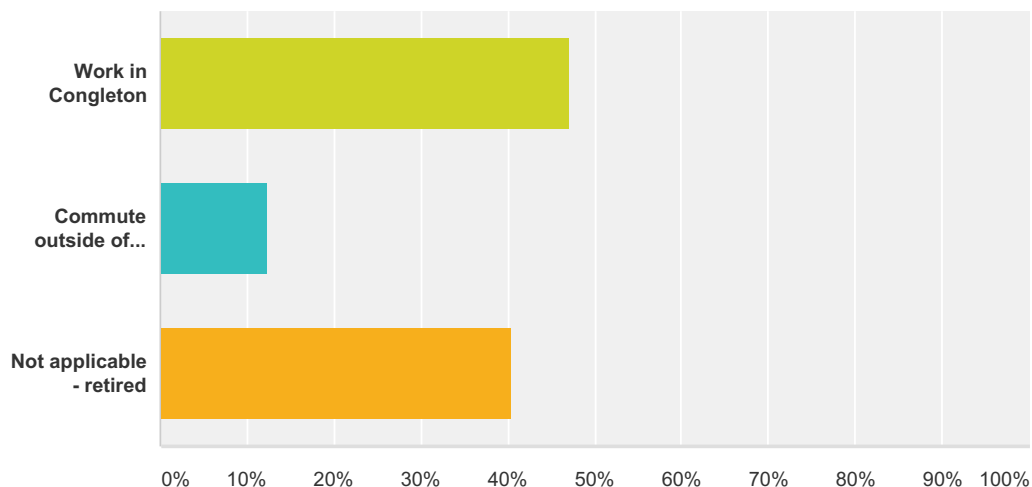

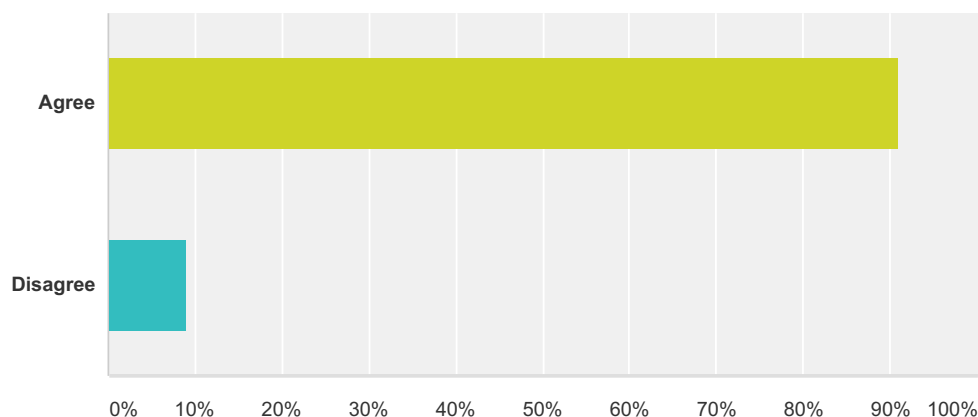

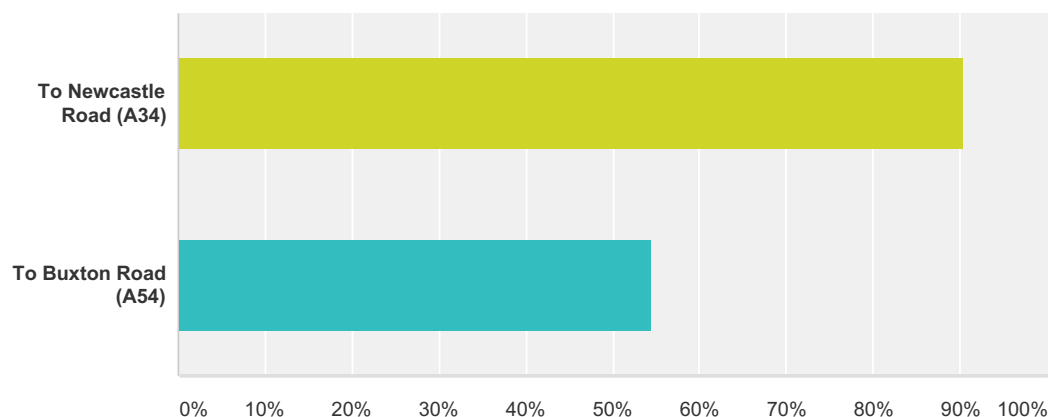

Q12 TRANSPORT: - Improving travel in and around Congleton. Do you think the Link Road should be extended (tick one, both or neither)

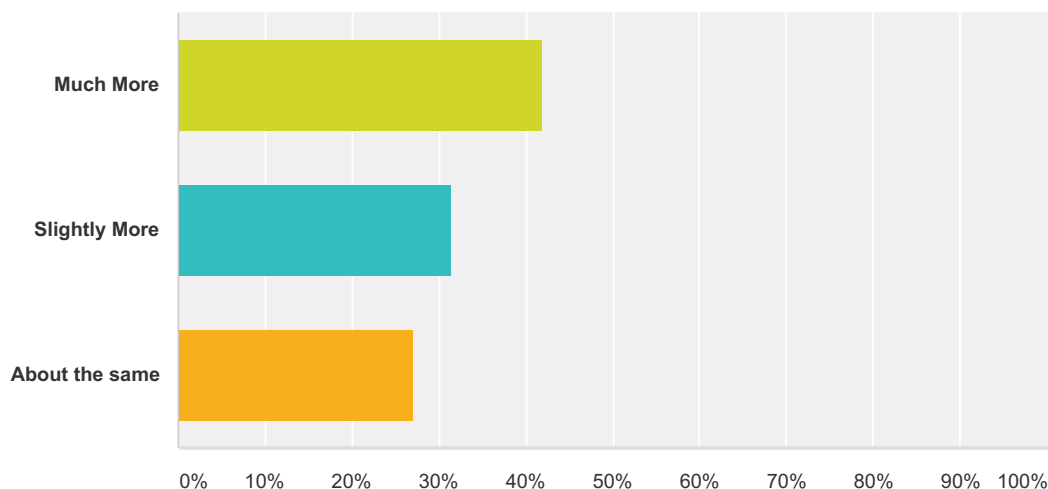

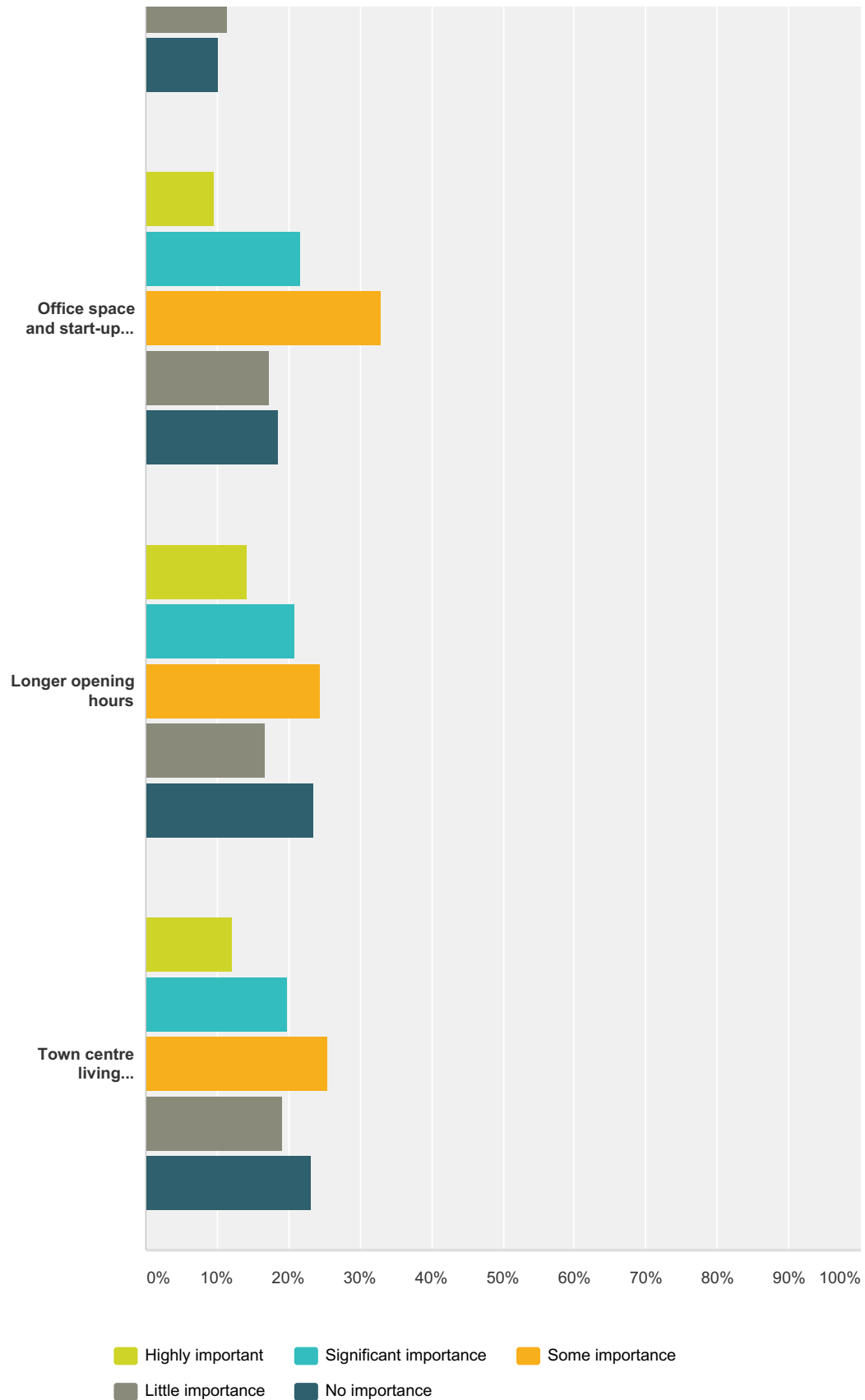

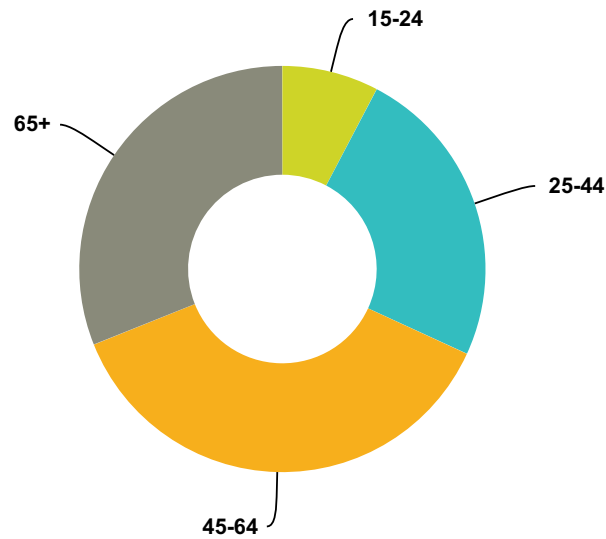

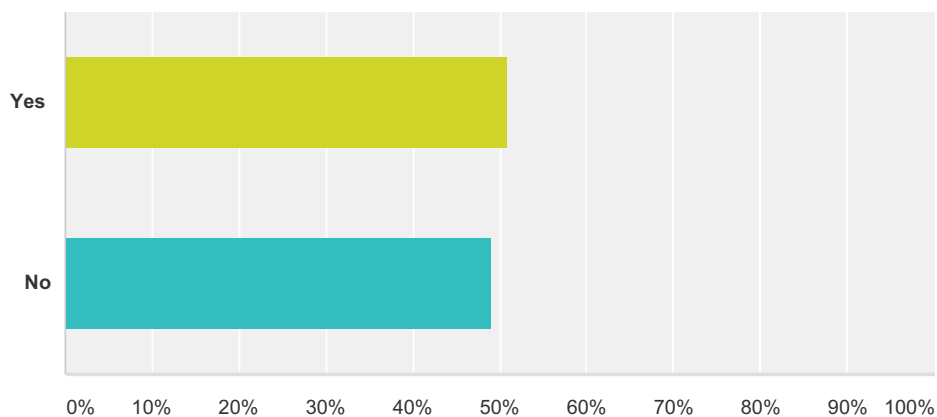

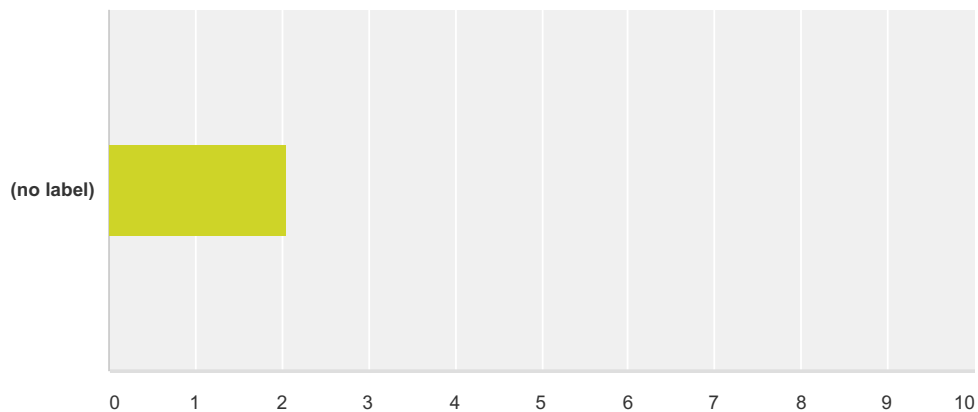

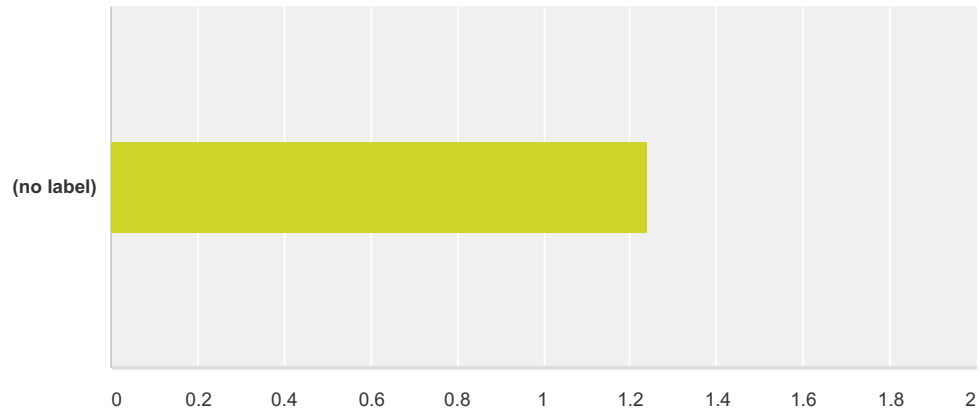

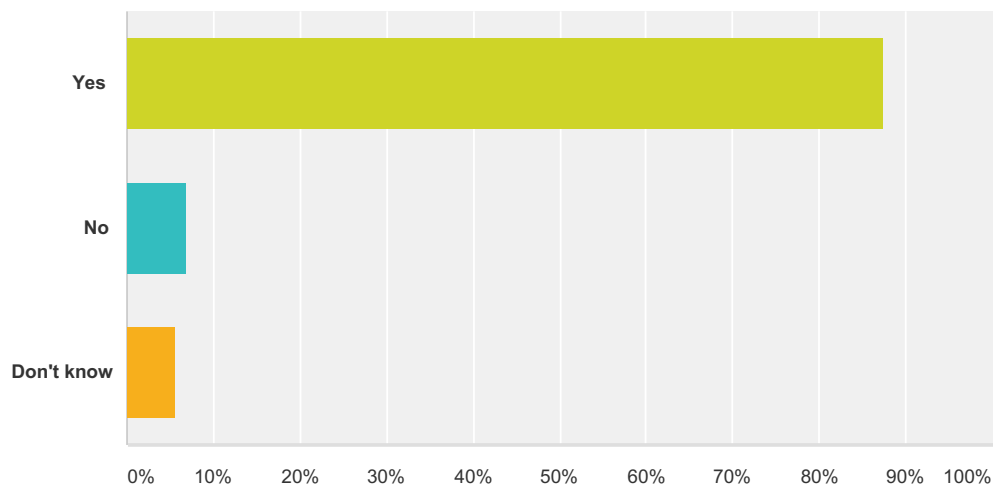

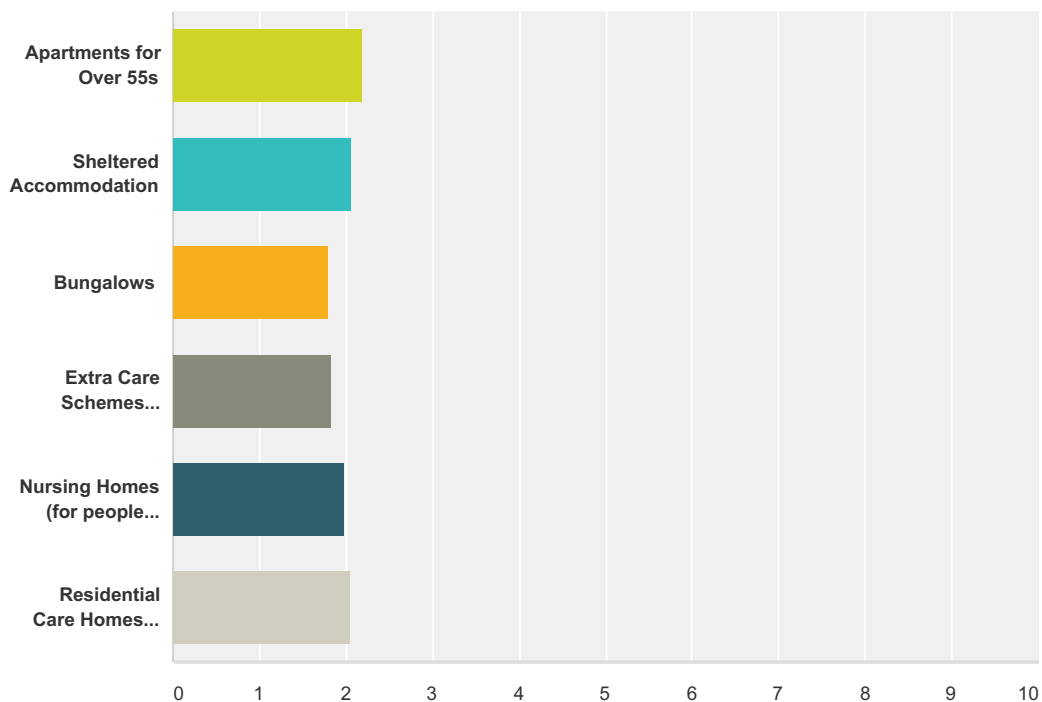

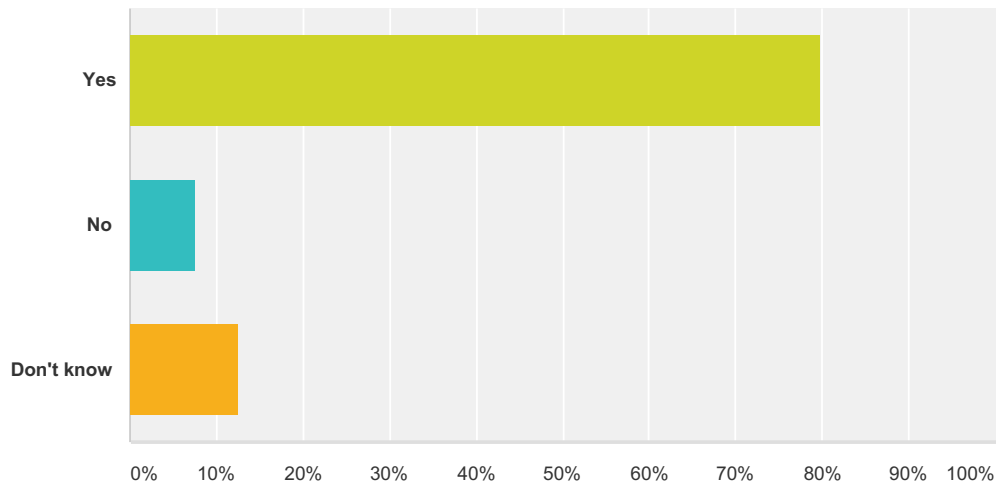

Developing a 'Neighbourhood Plan' for Congleton

But what is a Neighbourhood Plan?

Once completed and it passes the statutory tests, which includes a local referendum, it then forms part of the statutory development plan and must be used by Cheshire East Borough Council when making decisions on planning applications.

A comprehensive communication and consultation strategy will be put in place to ensure that the public and others are kept fully informed of progress and when consultation is to take place.

Congleton's Neighbourhood Plan team will be contacting you soon about your ideas for our town's Neighbourhood Plan. The Plan is all about how Congleton will develop and change over time and is the best way for local people to influence the development of the town. The plan will cover housing, employment, health and education, shopping and recreation, transport, green spaces – everything that makes a successful town where people want to live, work, visit and invest. Congleton's Neighbourhood Plan will look at the area within the town boundary.



Initially, the Neighbourhood Plan team will be looking for your thoughts on general principles for Congleton's development. Later there will be an opportunity to give more detailed views. The plan will only be approved if it meets statutory requirements and if 50% of residents who vote in the referendum approve it. When working on a Neighbourhood Plan we have to accept the housing figures and development planned for the area. July 2015 (Summer 2015)

Congleton's Neighbourhood Plan Needs YOU!

Consultation has started on Congleton's Neighbourhood Plan – one of the biggest opportunities Congleton has to influence the shape of future development in the town.

All residents should have received a basic Neighbourhood Plan questionnaire through their door in May with responses needed by the 20th June. If you have responded thank you. If you didn't manage to respond it's not too late to get involved. There will be further consultations and workshops and you can have your say at any time via www.mycongleton.org or @mycongleton

The Neighbourhood Plan team will analyse the results of the first questionnaire and use the information to help develop policies for Congleton and shape a more detailed questionnaire which you will receive notification about, later this summer. Please spare the time to fill in this questionnaire.

The Congleton Neighbourhood Plan is



complicated. There is likely to be around 3,500 houses built in the rural areas surrounding Congleton. Although these houses will be outside of the town's boundaries and the area covered by our neighbourhood plan, we would want and expect these new households to look to Congleton as 'their town'. We will need to cater for their needs in terms of employment, health, education, shopping and leisure whilst maintaining open spaces, heritage and other aspects of Congleton that people value.

October Autumn 2015

Congleton Neighbourhood Plan

Results of the First Survey

1406 people responded to the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan questionnaire - which represents the biggest response that the town has received to a survey in a long time. The questionnaire was delivered to households in Congleton in May with a deadline of June 20th to respond. One lucky entry, Leo Allan from CW12 4, received £250 for being the first entry drawn on the 22 June.

Some key findings from this survey were:

- 49% of those answering were not planning to move house. Of those that were planning to move the most popular location was to the outskirts of Congleton.
- 90% said new development land should be allocated near the Link Road with easy access to the M6
- 91% wanted to see the Link Road extended to Newcastle Road (54% to Buxton Road)
- 42% said they would cycle or walk much more if the footpaths/cycleways were improved
- All the green spaces listed were ranked as important with Asbury Moss and Hankinson's Field/Park receiving the highest number of number 1 rankings.
- A broader retail offer (60%) and an improved market (40%) were seen as the most important ways to improve the Town Centre
- Introducing Town Centre Heritage and Green Town Centre Trail was seen as most important for Heritage although all ideas were received favourably

The Demographics of those answering the questionnaire

- 49% male, 51% female
- 31% were 65+ years, 37% 45-65, 24% 25-44, 8% 15-24
- 54% owned their house outright, 30% owned their house with a mortgage
- 48% of people lived in two people households, 19% in four people households
- Almost 60% had lived in Congleton for more than 20 years, 21% less than 10 years
- More people from CW12 4 answered than any other postcode (41% CW12 4, 25% CW12 3, 13% CW12 2, 11% CW12 1)

Your help and views are needed to help develop the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan (NP). Creating a Neighbourhood Plan to take us to 2030, is a challenge and, through the emerging Local Plan, the area is set to grow by around 4,000 homes - which could mean an additional 9,000 people.

Much of the land that is expected to be developed is outside of the town boundary and so outside of our Neighbourhood Plan area. However, the impact and opportunities of more people needs to be planned for in our Neighbourhood Plan. We need to plan for employment, schools, medical provision, transport, places to shop, leisure facilities, green spaces and infrastructure to meet the town's growing population.

The Neighbourhood Plan gives us a Community the chance to say how our

town should evolve. What is important about Congleton that we need to retain and enhance. What policies and plans are needed to make the town work for its current and future residents.

Congleton Neighbourhood Plan Team would like to thank everyone who has already inputted into the Neighbourhood Plan process, and to encourage others to get involved and make their thoughts known. Look out for the next round of questionnaires this autumn. This questionnaire will be looking in more detail at what is important for Congleton. Where ever possible we ask that people fill in the form online.

Congleton's Neighbourhood Plan will set out a vision for the town until 2030. It needs to reflect the views of local people. Currently Congleton is building up evidence and capturing local opinion so that the draft plan is a robust one that can be defended.

The draft plan is being formed using a wide range of evidence - including that gained through the questionnaires. It will set objectives and policies on key issues such as housing, employment land, green space, transport and infrastructure, health and education needs, town centre development and heritage issues.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to respond to the second detailed questionnaire into the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan - We received almost 1,000 questionnaires and over 1,300 comments.

The responses to the questions, along with all the written comments are being considered by the various groups working on policy areas of the plan. A summary document of the results can be seen at: www.mycongleton.org

The second questionnaire revealed a strong endorsement for many of the policies being tested by the groups. In other areas policies needed to be worked on further to reflect concerns. All policy decisions need to be backed up with evidence and the group has felt the need to source further work on a transport study for Congleton which will be carried out in the next few weeks.

The Neighbourhood Plan Team is currently considering how changes put forward in the emerging Cheshire East Local Plan will impact on Congleton's Neighbourhood Plan. This is important as the Neighbourhood Plan will need to be in line with policies in the larger Local Plan.

In April the main work will be around reviewing the draft policies to make sure that they make sense and adhere to National and Local Planning Frameworks. In May we intend to hold a three week consultation on the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan draft policy document. Copies will be available online, at the Town Hall, Library and other key places for people to study.

In June the policies will be amended in light of comments received in the May consultation and then discussions will be held with Cheshire East about submitting the draft plan under Regulation 14 to Cheshire East. Once submitted there will be a 6 week consultation.

In September the plan will need to be reviewed taking on board any comments received in response to the Regulation 14 consultation.

Local people would have a vote on whether or not to accept the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan at a referendum in January or February 2017.

All the comments from this round of consultation will be considered in November, alterations made and then a further round of 'Regulation 15' consultation held. Neighbourhood Plan

Congleton's Neighbourhood Plan went through the Regulation 14 consultation from 2nd October to 13th November. A number of residents, developers and statutory groups submitted comments and the various sub groups are now working through those comments and where appropriate suggesting changes to the draft plan. The new draft plan will then be put through a further round of consultation, known as Regulation 15 consultation. Ultimately the plan will be put out to a referendum where Congleton Town electors can either approve or reject the plan. If approved the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan would be part of the planning documents for Congleton and need to be adhered to within future development.

Spring 2017 – October



Our Neighbourhood Plan is Reaching Regulation 14

As Bear Necessities was going to press, the Congleton Neighbourhood Plan team was in the final throws of getting all the policies ready to go to Regulation 14.

Regulation 14 is reached when the team is happy that the policies in the plan are right for the town and reflect the consultations with local groups and residents. At Regulation 14 the plan is sent out for consultation with all the statutory and other interested parties for their feedback. Regulation 14 consultation will last for 6 weeks.

After this time the Neighbourhood Plan team will take on board the comments and see how the plan needs to be modified before going to Regulation 15. This is the final statutory consultation which is managed by Cheshire East Council. Once it is clear that the plan is acceptable to the various statutory planning consultees, the Congleton Public will get a chance to vote on whether or not to accept the plan for the town. If accepted, policies in the plan will become part of the planning law for Congleton.
